A word from the director...

Something Rotten! is a musical about writing a musical, albeit a musical set in 1595 during Shakespeare's heyday. Nick and Nigel Bottom are two brothers having trouble earning a living as actors and writers in the shadow of William Shakespeare: everything The Bard touches turns to gold. They just can't seem to catch a break. So, Nick seeks out a soothsayer to find out "what the next big thing in theater will be". His soothsayer is full of visions, but unfortunately they are all just a bit... off. And following one of these "off" visions results in the hilarity that is Something Rotten!

Shakespeare was famous for borrowing from and reworking legends or other authors' material and *Something Rotten!* borrows or alludes to just about every Shakespearean convention you can imagine. There's a soothsayer, a Jewish money lender, a female character disguised as a man, a pair of star-crossed lovers, and lots of misappropriated lines from *Hamlet, Romeo and Juliet*, and *Richard II*. The score is full of homages to other works as well, so much so that the Wikipedia entry for the show lists 39 show references. In fact, the song *A Musical* in the first act contains 20 musical references alone!

Producing this show was a Herculean effort and could not have happened without a wonderfully talented group of production staff and volunteers. Sincerest appreciation goes to Ian Shaw, who has graciously provided professional-level lighting design for many shows at BCT. He spends dozens of unwitnessed hours creating a detailed light plot, refocusing and hanging additional lights, placing color gels in every fixture, and his lighting takes our productions from good to great. A big thank you to Dawn Janow for sewing 14 costumes and to several cast members who helped create some of the 90 costumes seen in this show totaling over 200 individual pieces of clothing! Another big thank you goes to Stephanie Clarke for her fun choreography, and our talented dance captains Elizabeth Dangelo and Cordelia Janow. Usually I end the director's notes by saying "hope you enjoy the show" but that would just be silly. I am confident you will love this show, this cast of diverse and talented actors, and the memorable music and characters in Something Rotten! Huzzah!
